## About Harry and Friends Notebooking Pages

This notebooking set is designed to be used with Harry Potter and The Sorcerer's Stone by JK Rowling. It can, however, be used in conjunction with ALL of the books.

Each character has a general notebooking page. Your children can write about their favorite moments with a character, or they can journal about that character as they read the book (or you read aloud to them). There are also several other activity sheets in this set, which will reinforce grammar, alphabetical order, and proofreading.

I have also included blank notebooking pages to be printed and used. Encourage your children to write poems, draw pictures – whatever their hearts' desire – to enhance their study of the book.

Special thanks to my children for helping me with this set. If it were not for them, I wouldn't have fallen in love with Harry. I tried reading The Sorcerer's Stone before I had children and put it down after 100 pages. Perhaps this is because my sense of adventure and fantasy wasn't fully developed until I had children. My children sat with me while I was creating the pages and offered comments and constructive criticism along the way.

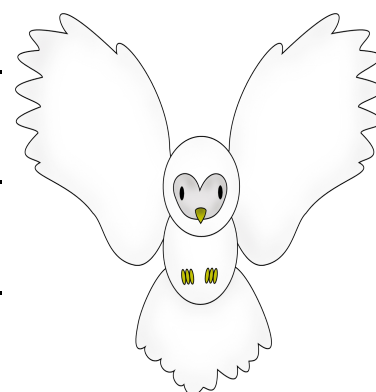

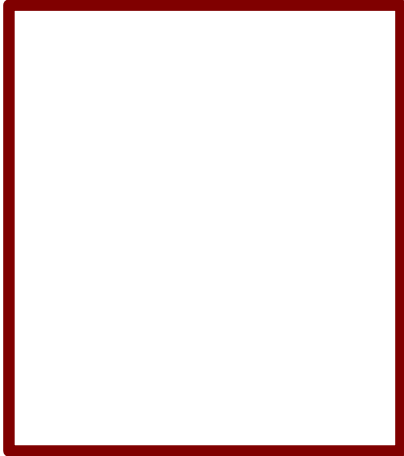
