Why not use your child's love of LEGO bricks and minifigures to inspire writing and creativity?

This download contains 10 writing prompts to get your LEGO lover thinking, creating, and WRITING. Each prompt is one page. If your child needs additional writing space I have included lined paper at the end for you to print. Also included are minifigs to cut and color.

Initially, your children may need some help getting their creative juices flowing. Maybe YOU want to use the prompts and write alongside your child. Perhaps you want to challenge your child to write on a prompt and then share it with the family at dinner time, or mail it to grandma and grandpa.

Don't worry about spelling or grammar – the object is to get your child to WRITE and enjoy writing. (I have included one simple grammar rule so your child has a "takeaway" from this download!)

You're means YOU ARE – it is a CONTRACTION.

(ex: You're playing with LEGO bricks.)

YOUR shows possession

(ex: Your LEGO creations are amazing!)

Do not confuse YOU'RE and YOUR.
